HOW M-PESA PAVED THE WAY FOR MOBILE MONEY TRANSFERS

M-PESA is a mobile app (application) from Kenya that is now used around the world, making it easy to transfer money through a mobile phone. M-PESA comes from the Swahili word for money, "pesa".

M-PESA has made digital money transfer possible without the need of a bank account. The application only requires you to have a mobile phone in order to transfer money. It was founded by a man named Nick Hughes in March of 2007 in Kenya. He started by introducing the app in rural areas and by December of the same year, there were about 1.2 million active users. M-PESA has completely transformed how Kenyans pay for goods and services.

HOW TO USE M-PESA

Using M-PESA is very easy, and perhaps this is the secret behind its success. The following is how to use your account.

1. Go to an authorized M-PESA agent, usually offered at any corner shop, with your phone and original ID

2. Inform the agent how much money you wish to deposit, or take out

3. They will use their agent phone to send you the e-money in exchange for cash, or the other way around

4.You and your agent will receive an SMS from M-PESA confirming the transaction

5. You can also top up your M-PESA account from your bank account. Most banks have a short code for mobile banking

Why is M-PESA mostly conducted in lower income countries?

This trend is probably because of the issue of bank accounts. Most people in developing countries live in the village. This means they are not able to go to a big town or city frequently, and most banks are found in the cities. Using M-PESA does not require you to have a bank account, and the app can almost act as a bank account if you need.

It's not good to carry a lot of money because you can face problems like theft. So, M-PESA simplifies keeping a lot of money on you without having to carry it.



You can still have a bank account and use M-PESA. M-PESA is not perfect, and you can lose your money if you lose your phone. So, it's a good idea for you to have a bank account as well. There are also some services

not really available through M-PESA like paying of the school fees.

Furthermore, when removing money through M-PESA, you are deducted some amount of money. The money that is taken is used to pay the organizational costs, like the people employed.

Generally, M-PESA has really paved the way for many people to be able to send and receive their money easily without the need of a bank.

It is also a huge story building;



WHAT HINDERS DEVELOPMENT OF THE TEXTILE INDUSTRY IN EAST AFRICA?

There are many different challenges facing East African societies. One area greatly challenged are the manufacturing industries. Examples of manufacturing include textile, sugar and the mining industries. The textile industry deals with manufacturing raw materials into finished products. An example is cotton that is used to make clothing fabrics.

Although the textile industry is doing a great job, there are some challenges that it faces. The lack of technology is one. Different textile industries do not have important machines that would help in running the textile processing faster. Due to shortage of electricity in East African countries, automation is not widespread because sometimes there simply isn't electricity to power big machines.

According to Musa Daudi from form 5, "textile industries fail due to lack of good technology. There are little advanced machines in the East African textile industry, compared to other countries that have machines and produce more quality products products compared to the of East Africa." Musa means that some of Tanzania's textile industry does not have advanced machines, and instead they use more traditional means of making clothing.

Poor Transportation There is poor quality of technology that would make it easier to transport products in a short period of time. Some of the roads ae not well constructed, and this can lead to slow distribution of products to different places.

Lack of skilled labour East African textile industries lack experts that have experience working in textile industries. This lack of education in the textile industries means that some of the labourers have never experience textile machinery.

According to Margreth Kafuru, a form 5 student, "In the textile industries not everybody has qualifications for being a worker. Some people, due to failure of their secondary education go seek jobs in the textile industries without having any education of the textile industry". Margreth is talking about people who work in the textile industry, and who do not necessarily have a good education, and are not worrying about the bigger problems in the industry.



Lack of support from the government

The government loans have become very difficult to receive because the government is mostly concerned with industries that make a lot of money. Industries fail to have proper development due to the lack of certain products, such as machines for making textiles. These are examples of where money would be helpful.

According to Shadrack Mollel, a form three student, "apart from the lack of support from the government, there is also a lack of empowerment. Meaning people do not give support to the workers who establish the textile industry, and this can make them want to give up."

Musa Daudi adds "The government gives out support, but the amount of money that is given to raise the textile industry is lacking. The amount sent by the government to the responsible people is not the full amount that goes to helping the textile industry." When the high rank of government give assistant to industries, the money is sent to the leaders. When leaders get the money, some of it is taken and it only helps the industry itself a little.

Lack of enough raw materials Poor raw materials are a problem when trying to make high quality clothing. Other countries found outside of East Africa have better raw materials because they choose only the best to use in their textile machinery.

According to Ivan Lyimo, a form four student, "To avoid all these challenges, the government should make sure that they are coming up with new innovative ideas on how to solve them, which will help the textile industries in their achievements in better production". According to you, what new innovative idea could help solve some of these problems?

These challenges can be solved in many different ways. One example is bettering the quality of raw materials. Different people growing cotton should at least be given



education on ways of increasing to quality output. The government should follow up on their

responsibilities, and make sure the money they loan to the textile industry actually helps better the industry.

Hindu weddings traditionally take three days. Most Indians are Hindu, one of the oldest religions in the world. The ceremony takes place in a "Mandap." This is a structure made (outside or inside) for the purpose of getting married under, according to an article titled *Indian Wedding Traditions*. Indian weddings involve both the bride's and the groom's family, symbolizing the families uniting together.

Indian weddings take so long because they have many steps that must be completed in order for the wedding to be finished. Some of the most important steps are: 1. Arrival of Vara Yatra - this is the step whereby the groom arrives to the Mandap with his party.

2. Kanyadaan - This is a Sanskrit word meaning "giving away the bride". This is among the most interesting steps because the bride's parents wash the bride and groom's legs with milk. This is for the purpose of purifying them for their new life together.




3. Wedding ceremony - The bride and the groom are seated next to the holy fire, and the union is formed.

4. Sindoor- This is when the red-orange powder is applied to the part of the bride's hair to indicate that she is married.

Indian women dress differently from other women in the world. Their traditional dress is a long skirt and short blouse that only covers their chest, sometimes known as a *sari*. According to an article titled *Dressing Indian Women through History*, regional variations are widely different. In southern India, even in colonial times, some women did not cover the upper parts of the body at all. Throughout India's history, contact with different cultures such as Greeks, Romans, Arabs and Chinese have influenced new fashions and ideas of how to dress. Indian cuisine uses a lot of spice, especially pepper. In South Indian homes, the meal is not complete without some rice complement. In North Indian homes, there are many different types of bread, like chapatti and roti. In East India, a favourite food to cook is Sandesh, made from sugar. Many spices are also used, above all chilies (green and red). The last is West Indian, which prefer to cook with local staples such as dried red chilies, rice, fish, peanuts, and vinegar.

Indian people have many different religions and therefore believe in different Gods like Shiva, Allah, and others. These beliefs in many different Gods makes their culture to be one of the most diverse in the world.

HOW THE CHAGAA TRIBE IS UNIQUE

Do you anything about the Chagaa tribe?

Chagaa is a tribe found in Tanzania. They live in the northern highlands of Tanzania in Kilimanjaro region. This is where the roof of Africa is found: Mount Kilimanjaro. The region is cold and evergreen. The main economic activities are agriculture and livestock keeping, and the main crops grown are coffee and bananas. This is because the climate of Kilimanjaro favours their growth. They were one of the first tribes to convert to Christianity, a result of colonialism. This may have given them economic advantage over other tribes, as they had better access to education and health care as Christians. Just like other tribes, the Chagaa have their traditional foods and beverages. Do you know what they eat and drink?

Madam Athanasia, TSSS (Tumaini Senior Secondary School) biology teacher, says,

"Chagaa eat banana as their staple food. Their traditional beverage (Mbege) is made from ripe bananas." Most of their foods are cooked by boiling and covered by banana leaves. Example of these foods are Kiburu (banana and beans), Kitawa (banana and sour milk), Mtori (meat and banana porridge, which is the main food eaten for a few days after a birth) and Kisusio (soup of blood). These foods are eaten due to the nature of crops and animals on the Chagaa land. You might be thinking that Chagaa eat only bananas, but that is not true.



Chagaa usually eat boiled yams and milk tea for breakfast, ugali and meat or pork and avocado for lunch, and food made from banana (example: Mtori) for supper.

According to Madam Mary Joseph, also a biology teacher from TSSS, Chagaa have several food taboos. Males are the only ones slaughtering cattle, and women are prohibited to be in the area when it happens. The meat is enclosed in a so called VISAGU (this is a parcel made from banana leaves where raw meat is enclosed), and only men or boys are supposed to open it.

After slaughtering, men eat together and the remaining meat is taken home for women and children. I think this taboo is probably to give respect and recognize men as the leaders of the family. Chrispina, a Form 3 Chagaa student, said "this taboo is a discriminatory taboo since it limits women from acquiring different priorities." Do you want to know how Mbege is prepared? Keep reading!



Accoding to Atlas Obscura Online, Mbege is prepared in three steps. Nyalu preparation, Mso preparation and mixing. Nyalu ferments the porridge made of ripened banana, and Mso makes sweet porridge made of germinated finger millet. After the preparation of Mso and Nyalu, they are mixed together to create Mbege. can be mixed with other vegetables), and jira (a spice used in making pilau). These spices are what makes Zanzibari food taste so delicious.

Zanzibar culture is a unique mixture of different influences. The adopted foods from Indians such as pancake (chapati),

Zanzibar is one of the most attractive places in Tanzania. It is surrounded by the Indian Ocean. From the 7th to 15th century the island was dominated and ruled by Arab and Indian merchants. The people who were living in Zanzibar before the Arabs and Indians arrived slowly adopted some of the culture from the Arabs and Indians (the way they dress, eat, cook, behave, etc). Zanzibar's history and economic development was largely based on spices and other food products. Lizzie Resta, a researcher, says "Zanzibar is known around the world as SPICE ISLAND".

Where do you think Zanzibari foods originated?

As you now know, Zanzibar adopted parts of Arab and Indian culture, and this has influenced the culture of cooking with lots of spices. Many of the crops grown in Zanzibar are spices. Some example are cloves, coriander seeds (hiliki), black peppercorns biriani and samosa, and also from Arabs such as halwa, brown rice (pilau, rice cooked with fried onions, it can be mixed with meat, potatoes and other ingredients like giligilan, pilau masala) and bokoboko. This is why their foods are spectacular as they are a mixture of different foods from different foreign countries.

What are the special foods made during holidays?

Most Zanzibaris are Muslims, and during the holy month of 'Ramadan' most of them fast

for 29 to 30 days. They don't eat from morning till the sunset prayers, and then they break the fast with a snack (dates or cookies) before they go for the prayer.



Zanzibari foods are delicious and have a lot of spices. Some of these foods you have never ever seen or heard of. То prove the delicious taste of Zanzibar's foods that you always watch, hear, and read about from

After the prayer, they have a special meal called 'Futar' where they eat brown rice, fried yams/sweet potatoes, roasted potatoes, wali wa nazi (rice cooked with mixed with filtered water coconut/coconut fluids), meat. and spagetthi. There is a festival known as Eid-el-Fitr that marks the end of Ramadan, followed by Eid-el-Hajj few months later. On these days, the whole atmosphere of the island and the nearby place are covered by different smells of good foods, which even if you were satisfied you will want to eat again and again.

Do you know anything about the Iraqw tribe? The Iraqw are a group of people who came from the Cushites. This means that they originated from the Ethiopia highlands from where they then dispersed to North Eastern Africa. In Tanzania, many Iraqw

live in the Arusha and Manyara regions, near the Rift Valley.

Housing style

According to Emmanuel Julius, a teacher at TSSS, "traditional Iraqw housing is called MATEMBE." Matembe is a house that is constructed underground and the roof of the house is made of mud. Generally, they are very small, but many people can live inside.

Economic activity

According to Lucas Bayda, a form 4 student at Tumaini Senior Secondary School (TSSS) and an Iraqw himself, "the economic activities of the Iraqw people is mainly mixed farming." This means they keep livestock, including hens and cows, and practice

Customs and traditions

The customs and traditions of the Iraqw people, according to Lukas and Mr Julius, are "clan organization, traditional dances, early marriage, polygamy, and the use of traditional medicines for treatment for different infections." These are traditional ways of living, but not practiced by all Iraqw today. A clan is different from a tribe. Clan organization means almost all people living in the same place are related.

Food

The foods mostly cooked by the Iraqws are ugali, makande, meat (cow, goat), and blood. The blood is boiled and then mixed with salt and taken with meat. Another food used a lot is milk. Iraqws take both fresh milk and sour milk. In terms of the preparation of food, they use pots to prepare it well cooked.

Dressing styles

According to Nelson Frank and Mr Julius, "clothes worn by the Iraqw were animal skins during ancient time, put on to keep warm. But in this generation, most cover their body with Maasai shukas and other normal clothing like trousers.

Iraqw life has greatly developed compared to ancient times when many practiced FGM (Female Genital Mutilation), early marriage, and poorer housing style. Development has happened mostly with education. Many Iraqw are now educated.

ALBINO'S LIVES MATTER

In Africa, the rate of discrimination against Albinos is still increasing. Some people think that Albinos are witches because of the way they look. This is not true. Albinism is a genetic disorder and People with Albinism (PWAs) are just like other human beings.

One way Albinos are discriminated against is by lack of education. Some are afraid of how people will treat them at school. Some parents warn their children not to talk with PWAs. Students are not even allowed to share equipment with them such as rulers, mathematical sets, pens etc. The government should provide PWAs educational materials which will help when they go to school. The government should also educate adults and students on how to treat PWAs.

Proper care for their health is also important because during the day the sun can hurt them and cause skin cancer. People who live with PWAs should provide them with sunglasses. We should never give up while helping them, nor care what people will say about you. Just focus on what you are doing because this life is yours not theirs.

Treat them just like other human beings because they are human just like us. What makes them different is their skin color. Imagine if they had melanin, they would be like you and me.

Another form of discrimination is harassing and hurting PWAs. Spreading false information can harm albinos, and people should definitely not call PWAs bad names. This makes them feel inhuman. *Kabula Nkara* is an Albino from Tanzania. She says that "we feel very bad and insecure because we sometimes see our friends being killed".

Some people kill Albinos in order to get wealthy, believing that it brings good fortune. Witchdoctors from Mwanza say that "If you kill an Albino and take its body parts you will become rich." Some also believe if you rape an Albino woman it cures AIDS (acquired immunodeficiency syndrome). Witchdoctors advise fishermen to take an Albinos bones and bring to them. Then the witchdoctor grinds it and if you sprinkle the crushed bones to the water you will get a lot of fish.

Miriam, Marisa and *Liotine* are albinos from Tanzania. They want people to know "we face a lot of challenges. For example, Miriam can't wash herself because she lacks both her hands, and she can't even hug her own child."

In 2008, in Lake Victoria region (Tanzania), more than 50 albinos were murdered, according to the United Nations. This is directly because of the rumors that say an Albinos blood, skin, and body parts brings wealth and good fortunes.

Victoria Ntetema is a BBC correspondent in Tanzania. She interviewed a witchdoctor and reported, "the witchdoctor says that prime ministers, religious men, and even politicians go to them in order to win a position." So, it is clearly not only uneducated people who believe rumors about albino's body parts.

PWAs are normal people, and when people scare them they live in fear. The thing they fear the most is death, and this is why they tend to hide. There should be more education for the public about PWAs. This will help to dispense the idea that PWAs are witches. The government should enforce strict laws to people who hurt albinos.

FEMALE GENITAL MULTILATION (FGM)

Cultural practises affect human lives. Around million 200 women in Africa have experienced FGM. which means circumcising women. These people are found in countries such as Benin, Burkina Faso, Cameroon, Central Africa Repulic, Kenya, Nigeria, Uganda, Tanzania and other countries. In the Middle East, countries like Yemen, Iraq, Iran, Israel and Egypt have some people who still practise FGM. The Maasai, a tribe from Tanzania, are the people who mostly practise FGM in Tanzania. Not all Maasai practice FGM.

People who conduct FGM believe it has an advantage, which is to control the women's appetite of sexuality. They believe this can

help women reach their goals in life by not getting pregnant when they're young. Some people in the Massai tribe conduct FGM at night because the Tanzanian government does not allow FGM.

Other places like Iraq conduct FGM when girls are still very young. This is done in order to avoid problems when they become adults. These societies consider FGM as an essential part of raising a girl and preparing her for womanhood and marriage.

Some say the practice of FGM originate from the Pharaohs of Ancient Egypt. The United Nations has reported that forms of FGM have been practiced in parts of Africa, parts of the Philippines, by certain tribes in the upper Amazon (South America), in the Arunta tribe in Australia, and by early Romans and Arabs.

The practice of circumcising women is normally carried out by older members of the community, who often lack proper medical training. This practice is performed on girls between infancy and the age of 15 years old. It is sometimes carried out as early as a couple of days after birth, as previously stated about Iraq. Instruments used to perform FGM are razor blades, knifes and other sharp objects.



FGM has no proven health benefits, but can cause serious life-long physical and psychological harm. The extent of damage caused can depend on the type of FGM performed, and on whether the practitioner had medical training and used sterile tools.

Some of the most common problems caused by FGM include severe bleeding, pain, shock, infection, menstrual obstruction, increased risk of urinary tract infections, HIV, mental health problems, sexual dysfunction including complications during pregnancy and child birth, sometimes can even lead to death.

Generally, FGM has been barred in most African countries as many other European and western nations. However, these laws are not always enforced and FGM continues to affect the lives of millions of women and girls in many places. People should stop FGM and understand that FGM is very dangerous to a women's life.

SELF DRIVING CARS

What are self-driving cars? Self-driving cars, also known as autonomous or driverless cars, are able to move on their own under a set of instructions known as *prototype programmes*. Prototype programmes are used to evaluate new design or to enhance precision by the system analyst and user.

According to the article "It's 2020, where are our self-driving cars?", author Kelsey Piper states that "in 2020, you will be a permanent backseat driver ". The Guardian newspaper predicted in 2015 that "10 million selfdriving cars would be on the road by 2020."

Experiments have been conducted on selfdriving cars since the 1920s. Promising trials took place in 1950s, and have proceeded since then.

In the 1980s, numerous major car companies and research organisations appeared with news ideas for self-driving cars such as Mercedes Benz, General Motors, Continental Automotive Systems, Bosch, Nissan, Toyota, Audi, Volvo, Vislab, and Google.

At this point the leading and most successful companies are WAYMO, GM CRIUSE, ARGO AL and TESLA.

How self-driving cars work

Self-driving cars basically rely on artificial intelligence (AI). AI are computer

programmes which make things to be more intelligent and work for humans.

Self-driving cars have high resolution cameras and lidar (light detection and ranging) as a way of estimating the distance of objects by bouncing lights and sound off of surrounding objects.

Car computers combine all these systems to build a picture of where other cars, cyclists, pedestrians and obstacles are and where they are moving. For this part a lot of training data is needed.

Training data is used as a program that helps a self-driving car to move and follow all road instructions as needed without making errors.

But training data illustrates an important principle of how helpful self-driving technology is when wondering where are the self-driving cars?

"Self-driving cars would be avoiding 81% of car accidents caused by human error" said Kelsey piper. CORONAVIRUS WORLDWIDE

Do you know how much scientists around the world are struggling to control the coronavirus? COVID 19, also known as coronavirus, is a pandemic disease that originated in China in a city called Wuhan. It started in December 2019, spread very quickly, and has affected populations all around the world.

How have pandemic diseases come into existence?

Pandemic diseases refer to diseases that spread worldwide and affect a large number of people. Throughout history, pandemics were seen as divine retribution sent to punish people for their sins. Rather recently we came to understand the causes and how to control them. The Black Plague, probably the most famous pandemic in history, killed 75-200 million people, peaking to its worst around 1347 to 1351. People misunderstood why this plague was caused, but now we think it came from rats and sewage problems.

There are still many different opinions about the coronavirus and how it has spread. The following are some sample interviews with students from TUMAINI SENIOR SECONDARY SCHOOL.

Neema, Form 3A, says that coronavirus was a punishment from God for the sins of people.

Anifa, Form 3A, believes that coronavirus came into existence due to the tendency of Chinese people to feed on bat meat. Collinsia, also of Form 3A, said that, "Coronavirus can affect other species apart from human beings like goats, pawpaw plants, and watermelons."

It is very easy for wrong information to be spread by people according to what they believe in. For example, superstitious beliefs, outdated customs and traditions can lead to misconceptions among people in society.

How is the discovery going of the COVID-19 vaccine?

No current medicine can prevent COVID-19 but researchers are currently testing and developing new vaccines and medicine options to alleviate mild to moderate COVID-19 symptoms.

According to the World Health Organization, roughly one in every six people with COVID-19 (16%) develops a severe respiratory illness. People with heart failure, kidney diseases and sickle cell anemia are very likely to develop severe symptoms.

Some of the currently used medicines used to treat Covid symptoms are acetaminophen,

which relieves mild to moderate pain of muscles, cough medicine, and COVID-19 Convalescent plasma, which means you take the blood from someone who has recovered from an illness and use it to help the infected person.

Further research is being done every day about the corona vaccine. Nearly 200 vaccine trials are underway, and more than 20 are already being tested on people. Some experts predict a vaccine could be ready for emergency use by the end of December, 2020.

As of 12 November 2020, Johns Hopkins University states that the recorded cases of Covid-19 cases around the world are 52,129,134 and total deaths are 1,284,465. Consequently, coronavirus is one of the deadliest pandemics that has occurred on earth since the Spanish Influenza of 1915.

SPACE ROCKETS TECHNOLOGY AND THE BENEFITS OF ROCKETS

Imagine flying to outer space. With a rocket, people can go beyond our world.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND OF ROCKETS

Sputnik was the first rocket to go to space on the 4th October 1957. Today's rockets are a remarkable collection of human ingenuity. In the past, rockets were mostly used as weapons, such as the v-2 rocket (in Germany called the A-4). These kinds of rockets were small in comparison to today's rocket.

Space rockets are powerful jets (jet engines) designed to carry people and objects beyond the earth. Rockets need huge amounts of energy and great speed to overcome the pull of gravity, so as to not fall back down to earth like stones.

STRUCTURE OF A ROCKET

There are two designs of rockets: manned rockets controlled by astronauts, and unmanned rockets. Unmanned rockets are controlled by technology applied to the rocket to be self-programmable.



Unmanned rockets contain structures that hold equipment for space missions, similar to a fuselage on a plane.

The structure that holds unmanned rockets are as follow:

>The propulsion system (engine, fuel tank, and rocket boosters)

>The guidance system (onboard computerbased navigation that steers the rocket to its destination)

>The payload (area for carrying supplies and satellites to space station)

WORK OF ENGINES

A rocket's engine is a part of its propulsion system. Rockets differ from a jet, plane and flying vehicle on earth. This is in part because they carry their own oxygen and other fuel like liquid oxygen and liquid hydrogen. This fuel ignites the rocket to launch. Rocket engines are much bigger and stronger than airplane engines.



LAUNCHING SITES

Rockets have special places to launch known as *launch pads*, where rockets are held before taking off. The best place to launch is near the equator. This is because rockets get pushed off more easily near the earth's spin. The rocket gets a stronger push against gravity when it takes off.

The largest launching site is Baikonur which is found in Kazakhstan. Baikonur usually sends space crafts to the International Space Station (ISS).



Launching sites around the world are numerous. There are about thirty (30) in total, but the mains one are; Vandenberg (USA), Cape Canaveral (Kennedy Space Center) (USA), Koura (French Guiana), Yasny (Russia), Jiuquan (China), Baikonur (Kazakhstan), Sriharikota (India) and Tanegashima (Japan).

STAGES OF ROCKET LAUNCH

Rockets have stages when taking off into space, these stages are:

First stage

After the rocket takes off from earth, the lower part detaches. This includes the boosters on each side of the rocket, and takes place around an altitude of 100km (62 miles) in just three minutes after launching.

Second stage

This is the stage whereby the middle part of the rocket, which is the main engine, fires for about nine minutes in total after from the launch, at a height of 200km (140miles) the main engine shuts down and detaches with the payload.

Third stage

This is the upper part of the rocket, also known as the payload. In this stage, the payload is ignited by much smaller engines which produce 2.6 tonnes of thrust just to put the rocket into its final orbit ready to release the satellites which are carried by the payload.



MUSIC AND SOUND TECHNOLOGY

Is music technology heading towards better quality?

Technology of music and sound production is developing every day around the world. Music development started in ancient times. Music developers are constantly working to improve the quality of sound. Music technology is indeed heading to better quality.

Concept of music technology

Music technology is the use of science to improve the sound quality of music. Music started developing since around 2600 to 2500 BCE, when instruments were made from animal bones into lyres and harps. As the years went on, man developed quality ways of presenting and playing music. Eventually, the invention of recording sounds was born.

Origins of recording and play back:

The improvement of music technology is ongoing. First, man invented the phonograph (1847) which enabled people to play and record the human voice using a wax cylinder. Next, the gramosphere (1882) was created to replace the cylinder with a disc. This is when the carbon button microphone was invented. The microphone became the basis for recording voices on the telephone.

The improvement of music in 21st century

In the 21st Century, music making technology has developed into making instrumental beats by vibrating and creating quality sounds produced by instruments or people's voices. Headphone and earphone technology has also been improved greatly. Some modern earphones are worn over the ears to keep out sound from the surroundings, allowing the listener to hear only the music.



Technology of sound recording

According to the book *Sound and Waves*, sound waves from voices, musical instruments, and other sources are changed to electrical signals when recorded. The most common instruments used in electronic



music are synthesizers, computers, and samplers. The music begins as electrical signals which are then fed into loud speakers, turning the signals into sound waves. Modern synthesizers and similar devices can produce any sound we want. Apart from editing the sounds using the instruments mentioned above, synthesizers can also help us to control the sounds.

Mixing of music

The electrical signals from different sources of sound are usually fed into a mixing board. According to DJ Geof (Mr. King) the mixing board can alter the volume of any sound such as a person's voice, guitar, piano or drums. These sounds are fed into their own channel or track. An article from the *New York Times* explains how the mixer can change not only the volume but also the different frequencies that make up the sound by changing the electrical signals.

Views on development of music

Music is believed to be improving in quality, through the use of simple tools which will help people in producing quality sounds and musical beats.

Knowledge of sound technology is not only

used in music, but also in improving sounds in transport industries and other business activities. where engineers acoustical the scientific use knowledge of sound to improve its quality. For example, sounds from Ferraris and Bugattis differ from other kinds of transport. Music

technology is improving through the investment of different musical instruments, and other simple tools which help in providing better sounds in music.



ROBOTICS AND THE HEALTH CARE SYSTEM

Have you ever thought about a surgery that can be done in a couple of minutes? Robots are capable of doing surgery that quickly, because they are programmed machines.

The meaning of robotic surgery

According to the *MedGenMed* website, robotic surgery is surgery done with the help of surgical robots. They continue, "a surgical robot is a self-powered, computer controlled device that is programmed to aid in positioning and manipulation of surgical instruments." This can enable the surgeon to carry out more complex tasks.

Worldwideapplicationandcontribution of robotic surgery.

China is among the countries on the front line in applying surgical robots. China is making many new surgical robots. For example the Beijing-based company Tinavi Medical Technologies "received fast-tracked approval from the central government to sell the TiRobot" reported Sarah O'Meara. The TiRobot is used for orthopedic surgeries, which means surgeries that repair bones and joints.

You may be wondering if any African countries are using robotic surgery. According to my research, African countries are trying to apply robotic surgery, though they have not developed as much other countries. This is mostly due to financial issues.

The process of surgery before the invention of robotic surgery

Before the invention of robotic surgery, surgeons performed two main types of surgery: video-assisted thoracoscopic surgery (VATS), and laparoscopic surgery.

These two surgeries are timeconsuming and tiresome. Challenges like this encouraged scientists to sit down and come up with an advanced method of surgery, which is how robotic surgery came to be.

In general, robotic surgery covers the limitations of the first two methods by reducing blood loss and comfort of the patient, and can even influence early recovery.

Moving into the future, VATS and Laparoscopic surgery will not be performed as much and robotic surgery will take over. As the MedGenMed website remarks, "almost all surgery can and will be performed by robotic surgery in the future".

Robo-Health workers

Robo-health workers are robots that are performing activities in a hospital. "The robots are taking temperature, monitoring the vitals of victims and feeding information back to health professionals" reported Rebecca Root. The COVID-19 disease is transmitted very fast, mainly through contact between the infected person with the other uninfected person. In this case the robo-health workers help to reduce healthcare the contact between workers and patients during treatment. As Dr. Gabin Mbanjumucyo (Head of the emergency medicine faculty at University Teaching Hospital of Kigali in Rwanda) said, "many health care professionals have lost lives by getting infections through direct contact with patient". The effects on hospital staff that is caused by the pandemic COVID-19 can be reduced by the robo-health workers.

Therefore, the robotic surgery and robots in general perform very heavy tasks. But until being programmed, they have no ability to perform any activities. Robots will still need the interpretation of a trained doctor to help with diagnosing signs and symptoms of certain diseases. As Mr. Bernd Stahl (the director of Montfort University Center for Computing and Social Responsibility) said, "You cannot have a robot coming in and care of granny. These taking capabilities don't exist". So some activities in the health science field will need to continue to be performed by man and not robots only.

THE TRAGEDY OF HIV/AIDS

HIV stands for "human immune virus" and AIDS stands for "acquired immunodeficiency syndrome". AIDS is caused by the HIV virus, which attacks the body's immunity, white blood cells, and also the lymph nodes. HIV is transmitted by certain bodily fluids such as blood, semen, breast milk.

Scientists are not sure exactly what caused the HIV/AIDS virus, and how it originally infected humans. But they believe that the virus came from primates in Africa, around 100 years ago. In 1981, AIDS was named by doctors as a new disease. Since scientists named AIDS, the disease has spread to every country in the world. According to UNAIDS program, around 75.7 million people have been infected with HIV since the beginning of the epidemic, and about 32.7 million people have died.

MODES OF TRANSSIMISION OF HIV/AIDS

1. HIV can be transmitted through unprotected sexual intercourse with an infected person

2. Through birth (from an infected mother to unborn baby)

3. By using an unsterilized surgical instrument and skin piercing tools such as needles, syringes, and others

4. Through transfusion of infected blood

5.Breast feeding if the mother is infected with HIV

SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS OF HIV/AIDS

There are different levels associated with symptoms of HIV/AIDS. Levels of infection are divided into four stages which are the primary stage, asymptomatic stage, symptomatic stage, and full-blown AIDS.

In the primary stage, meaning after initial

infection, the patient experiences sore throat, pain in muscles and joints, swelling of lymph nodes, rashes, and headache.

In the asymptomatic stage, meaning you're infected but you don't show symptoms, the patient remains healthy and lives in a normal life. This stage could last up to 20 years if the person is taking medication.

In the symptomatic stage, a person's health starts to become weak and show signs such as fever, skin rashes, and become vulnerable to tuberculosis and other illnesses. A person's body immunity decreases rapidly leading to opportunistic infections, like the flu or even coronavirus.

Lastly, full blown AIDS in the stage where the body will develop severe symptoms such as shingles pain, full skin rashes called herpes zoster, continuous diarrhea, vomiting, painful sores in the mouth, loss of memory, confusion, skin cancer, and feeling pain and needles in the hands and feet.

EFFECTS OF HIV TO BOTH THE SOCIETY AND INDIVIDUAL


To begin with, the biggest effect to an individual is that HIV can lead to death. This is because AIDS does not have treatment to cure it yet. On the side of the society, it increases street children due to high cases of HIV/AIDS in small and developing countries which are more affected.

For example, Democratic Republic Of Congo (DRC) is one of the developing countries where most lives depend on small business, so when the country is affected with HIV the country's economy won't grow, thus there is an increase of poverty and loss of man power.

PREVENTION OF HIV & AIDS

You can avoid HIV by the following measures: avoiding sexual intercourse with an infected person, avoid sharing sharp tools and wear gloves when touching a HIV patient body fluid e.g. blood.

I advise people to prevent themselves against HIV, as HIV/AIDS is a killer disease. Up to now, there is no cure for HIV in any country. There is only medicine that can help boost the body's immunity and makes infected people non detectable, but does not cure the disease. People who have HIV should eat a balanced diet and do some exercise for body fitness.



TECHONOLOGY IN GRAPHIC DESIGN

"It is made for hours but touches millions within seconds," said Mr Garyson Ephata, a teacher at TSSS (Tumaini Senior Secondary School). Mr Ephata is commenting on how graphic design takes a lot of time to be created, but can spread to many within a short time through technology.

TECHNOLOGY WITH DESIGN

Graphic design is the skill or art of combining text and pictures for advertisements, magazines, books etc, usually using technology. There are several software programs used by graphic designers, among them are three that are most popular. They comprise almost all tools necessary for graphic designing.

The three major technologies are Adobe Photoshop, Adobe InDesign and Adobe Illustrator. These technologies have helped graphic design become more simple than it was before. Graphic design before technological advancements was difficult because engraving letters, drawing, and painting was all done manually. Designers didn't have programs with speed to simplify their work. "Designers use only a little time to make something spread to many people with the help of technology. With technology, graphic design is like a piece of cake," said Mr Goodluck Haule, a teacher at TSSS.


These three software programs are not the only technologies used by graphic designers. There are other minor softwares, such as Adobe Muse and Adobe After Effect. The technologies are regarded as minor because they do primary editing and formatting of the layout but they can't perform other functions such as proximity and balance.

Graphic design cannot be conducted without having a set of rules or guidelines that will lead the designer to a good result.

PRINCIPLES OF GRAPHIC DESIGN.

According to Gareth David, a graphic designer, "contrast, design, hierarchy, alignment, balance, proximity, repetition, simplicity and function" are the basic principles of graphic design.

Regarding this information, we see that balance, proximity, simplicity and function are the major principles of graphic design. Gareth David is among the most talented graphic designers in the world.

A rule can give direction of which step to begin first and what to follow. For instance, you start with and end with....

HOW DIAMON PLATNUMZ SUCCEEDED IN MUSIC




Khaled also writes lyrics on his own and produces song for his troop. Khaled's efforts

A BOY FROM TANDALE: THE RISE OF DIAMOND

Diamond Platnumz is the best recording artist and dancer from Tanzania. He was always interested in music, but his life as a musician officially began after his Form Four graduation in 2006. His life is quite unbelievable.

Diamond Platnumz real name is Naseeb Abdul Juma. He was born on 2 October, 1989 at Amana Hospital Tandale in Dar es Salaam. He joined

West Tandale Primary School in 1996 and completed primary in 2002. When Naseeb was in standard five, around 10 years old, he showed an interest in music. His mother bought him albums of different artists and assisted him in writing lyrics. One of his family members were of the view that music was a waste of time and could never be a real career. Instead they wanted his mother to encourage him to concentrate on his education. In 2003 Naseeb started secondary school, and managed to graduate in 2006. After graduation, he started making music full time.

He started music when he was 19, though it was difficult. He was trying to raise money for a studio session in 2007. His mother gave him a gold ring to wear, and he went to sell it for \$35. He saved 5 dollars and took 30 dollars to studio. The studio where he recorded his first album was SHAROBARO RECORDS.

He recorded his first major hit "NENDA KAMWAMBIE" (go tell her), released on 14 February 2010, which introduced him into the Tanzania market. Esupart, Form 3 student, said "Nenda Kamwambie is a soulful song reflecting on the girl he loved", the song was a dedication to his girlfriend who left him when he had nothing. Naseeb transitioned his music from passion to career. Naseeb, now known by his stage name Diamond Platnumz, created Wasafi Records.

Before the official introduction of Wasafi, Diamond performed a show in Burundi, in 2013, where he influenced and inspired a producer called Siraj commonly Khamees. known as Laizzer Classic from Kigoma. Laizzer supported Diamond, and together they formed the label known as WCB (Wasafi Classic Baby) in 2014. Through the working partnership Laizzer and Diamond, between Laizzer turned himself into Avo Laizzer, and decided to add more members to raise the Wasafi ecosystem. The first member to join WCB was Rajab Kahali, also known as Harmonize in 2015. Other artists on the label are Raymond Mwakyusa Yusuph (Rayvanny), Mbwana Iddi-(Lavalava), (Mbosso), Abdul Mwanahawa Abdul (Queen Darling), and most recently Zuhura Othman (Zuchu).

Diamond Platnumz's family lives in Dar es Salaam. Diamond`s mother is

> Sanura Kasimu and father is Abdul Juma. He has three siblings Romea Abdul Jones, Esma Platnumz and Mwanahawa Abdul "Queen Darling". In recent months, Diamond publicly fell out with his partner Zari Hassan and then moved on



with Hamisa Mobetto, then moved on to Tanasha Donna. Barely two months since Diamond Platnumz broke up with his ex-girlfriend Tanasha Donna, Amberlulu a musician from Tanzania, said she would love to replace Tanasha Donna as Diamond Platnumz's girlfriend.

Currently Diamond has a net worth of \$10 million. He owns an Embraer Phenom 100, a private jet that costs \$3million. He also owns cars like an Audi 45 (\$50,000), Porsche Caymans (\$67,7000), and Ferrari (\$3 million). Diamond also managed to have partnerships with celebrities all over, including global brands such as Ishmael "Omarion" and American hiphop star Rick Ross.

His videos have been watched more than 1 billion times on YouTube. A video that did well is "Yope remix", a collaboration with a DRC (Democratic Republic of Congo) musician Innos B. Diamond Platnumz has more followers on Instagram than subscribers on YouTube. "Quarantine" was among Diamond Platnumz videos that has the most views. Shukuru, a form 3 students, says "Quarantine is an awesome song that I love watching because it gives me a chance to see Diamond's house; it's so big and beautiful. The song also motivates good dance moves and encourages people to make their own videos

dancing". The song drives people to YOUTUBE, and the more viewers the video has the more money can be made.



WHY DOES ALBERT EINSTEIN MATTER?



The greatest scientist of all time is Albert Einstein. He was born on March 14, 1879 in Germany. He spent almost all of his time in a laboratory doing scientific research. This led him to prove his theories and discover more than anyone else. "Albert Einstein is often cited as one of the most influential scientists of the 20th Century. His work continues to help astronomers' study everything from gravitational waves to Mercury's orbit," says Elizabeth Howell, a journalist who did research about Einstein. Albert Einstein has played a big role in the field of astronomy. Until now, astronauts use his equations and theories to study everything surrounding the universe including the motion of planetary objects like stars and planets.

Einstein came up with a famous and equation: $E=MC^2$. It is a relatively simple equation, but it brought a big impact on the world. In the formula ($E=MC^2$), E stands for Energy, M stands Mass and C stands for the Constant speed of light. This equation was proved to be effective in the first massive nuclear bomb explosion. The equation is used to measure the amount of energy released by tiny particles, like electrons in atoms. It's also used in the invention of the electron microscope, X-rays, and devices that produce light such as bulbs.

Through his knowledge of relativity, Einstein helped in developing the Global Positioning System (GPS) clocks. This is a computerized navigator device which guides drivers, locates and tracks positions of airplanes, cars, vehicles, phones and other devices with Internet Protocol (IP) addresses.



He later developed a theory of lasers. A laser is a device which produces very powerful beams of light. The laser light can help to record music, computer data and other information as a pattern of tiny bits on the surface of a special disk. The commonly used special disks are CDs and DVDs.

Life outside science

Albert also had his own family. He married twice and had three children (Lieserl, Edward and Hans Albert) with his first wife Mileva Maric, but the fate of their first child Lieserl, born 1902, is unknown. After he divorced Maric in 1919, he married his cousin Elsa Lowenthal.

What Einstein liked

Einstein enjoyed riding his bicycle, sticking out his tongue (this is seen from many of the photos taken of him) and also played the violin. Albert Einstein died of an aortic aneurysm on April 18, 1955. A blood vessel burst near his heart. According to the American Museum of Natural History (AMNH), when Albert was asked if he wanted surgery to be done, he said "I will go when I want to go" and added "it's tasteless to prolong life artificially. I have done my share, when it's time to go, I will do it elegantly".

"Albert Einstein is a great scientist because of his inventions. I can say he is among the pioneers of today's inventions" says Mr. Mwashambo, my physics teacher.

What comes to most people's mind is that the patient is bewitched. This can be a source of losing trust among each other. Caleb, a student from TSSS, said he is afraid of witchcraft because he believes that "your enemy is a witch. A witch is a person who doesn't want you to

In other words, it is hard to rely on one belief (witchcraft or religious beliefs). The trust in both beliefs is usually due to parental



upbringing. Some families, who are associates of witchcraft, tend to pass this practice from one generation to another through inheritance. "After church people go to black magic "said Fideo Mondi, a journalist from Kenya.

In a real-life sense, witchcraft acts as an equalizing agent. "If a person gets too high and mighty, his fellow villagers might accuse him of witchcraft and strip him of his assets" said Gershman, a journalist


from Sub-Saharan Africa. Also "Through black magic power (witchcraft) people have succeeded in their business, job opportunities like in schools, private institutions and even in government positions by seeking help of witches" said Mr. Emmanuel Julius. These people are thought to be given power through objects like sticks, pens or "Irizi" (an amulet) to support them in their success.

Witchcraft is negatively used by "means of killing and skinning albinos to attain wealth... this has happened at Mbozi and Tunduma in Tanzania," reports Kiangiosekazi Wanyoka from Tanzania Daily News in Dar-es –Salaam.

HOW DO YOU GET CONNECTED TO WITCHCRAFT?

Mr. Nyambosa Muniko, an English teacher from TSSS, said "the time when you start believing in witchcraft is when you become connected to witchcraft". You can be connected through your background which is made by having covenants with evil spirits or demonic powers.

Renatha, a student from TSSS, said that "Fasting can help to remove evil spirits and



purify the body". It happens only if you have faith in God and not witchcraft.

According to my personal research, around 80% of people in the Northern and Central parts of Tanzania do not practice witchcraft. Most believe witchcraft exists but they do not engage in practices.


There are some extra programs for Form Four students like doing exams every weekend which makes them revise constantly. This proves that this Form Four is prepared to do wonders.

SIMBA AND YANGA'S RIVALRY

The rivalry of Simba and Yanga is the result of them being oldest clubs in Tanzania. Simba and Yanga were originally one team, called New Youngs, established in 1935. In 1936, the team split up and a new club was formed, called Sunderland. Sunderland changed names several times, and eventually in 1971 they decided on Simba Sport Club. Yanga was called Dar es Salaam Young African SC, and eventually just Young Africans Sports Club, or Yanga for short.

Vodacom Premier League, created in 1965, arranges the matches between Tanzania's top football teams. Yanga and Simba have played a total number of 105 matches in the league. Wekundu Wa Msimbazi (Swahili for Simba team) has won 31 matches while Wananchi (Yanga) team won 37 matches and they drew 37 matches. There are a number of reasons that make these teams have such a competition, such as fans and titles.

Michael John, Form 5 student from Tumaini Senior, said "Simba and Yanga have high competition due to: both having

huge fan bases in Tanzania and East Africa which create pressure on the teams; both having a desire to win trophies and make history in Tanzanian football; pressure to be like successful other International clubs such as ALL ALLY (Egyptian football team)." Their rivalry increases efficiency and creativity on both teams because they want to achieve what international clubs have achieved.

TEAM FANS

There are many fans of these teams both outside and inside the country, more than any other clubs in Tanzania. These fans influence competition between the two clubs. Simba has approximately 35 million fans, while Yanga has approximately 35.2 million fans. This is why Yanga is called "Wananchi team", meaning "citizens team", because they have more fans.

In form 3 at Tumaini Senior Secondary School, there are many fans of these two teams. 30 students are fans of Simba and 31 students are fans of Yanga.




Simba signed a contract with Clatous Chama from Nkana FC of Zimbabwe. These two teams have produced players who are now playing outside of Tanzania clubs such as Mbwana Samatta, who now plays for Aston Villa, and previously played for Simba. Simon Happgod Msuva, who previously played for Yanga, now plays for Diffaa El Jadida, in Morocco.

The two teams have been competing to break the number of trophies they can win from inside and outside the country. Some such competitions are CAF (Confederation of African Football) and CECAFA (Council of East and Central Africa Football Association). Wekundu Wa Msimbazi (Simba) have never won the cup for CAF, but have reached the highest level of success in 1993 when they lost the game in the semi-final to Stella Abidjan of Cote d'Ivoire. Wekundu Wa Msimbazi (Simba) had a memorable year in 2003 when they knocked out the reigning champions Egypt Giant Zamelek on their way to qualify for group stages. Wananchi (Yanga) team have also never won a cup but have reached high levels as well, although they still have not broken Simba's record. In Vodacom Premium League, Yanga are leading by 27 league trophies while Simba has 21 league titles.

NATURAL TALENT

The two teams are also competing to find the best players from different academies in order to win their rivalry. Young Africans have recently made contact with Tuisime Kisinda, a player from AS Vita, a Congolese football club.




MBWANA ALLI SAMATTA IS AMONG THE MOST POPULAR PLAYERS IN AFRICA


WHY DOES LYNCH CALL HERSELF "THE MAN"?

Currently, Wallance Karia is the president of TFF. Karia succeeded the previous president Jamal Martin in August 2017.



WHAT IS THE BACKGROUND OF CECAFA?





POLICE BRUTALITY AND THE BLACK LIVES MATTER MOVEMENT



This is a communicable disease, meaning it can transferred from one person to another easily.


It disproportionally affects elderly and ill people with different preexisting conditions. They are more likely to get diseases such as COVID 19, as well as other diseases like cholera.

The virus especially affects the body through the lungs. Doctor Rutherford, who works at a university in San Francisco, says that people who are 80 years old don't have as strong lungs as people who are 20 years old. For example, a person who is 80 years old has breathed in a lot more smoke in their life than someone who is 20.


The next presenters were Form 3 dancers, led by dance club leader John. They danced to the song 'Amaboko' by Diamond Platnumz and Ravanny.
